Resident Jim Lamb complimented Highway Supervisor Slake and his team for cleaning the ditches.

Supervisor Willis stated on November 20th the bond closes. Attorney McKertick will send the bond paperwork to the town hall for signatures then they will be taken to NBT to be finalized.

Code Enforcer, Mark See asked council if they had reviewed the proposed price changes provided for this month meeting.

Letters will be sent from Attorney McKertick and the county in regards to issues in the document.

Resident Lamb suggested a possible site on Lewis Road if that may be an option.

Attorney McKertick will reach out to Verizon with concerns voiced by town residents.

Supervisor Willis commented on the new heating system. Leaks in the roof seem to have ceased for the time being after patching was performed by Councilman Dan Baker this will allow time to gather information and quotes to replace the roof.

The spray foam for the ceiling quotes come in and Jake has spoken with them as to what it would be involved for when it could be applied. Supervisor Willis asked the board to motion for approval to begin.
